- Referee and Kata Judges Registration:
 - o Online registration is mandatory for all referees and kata judges.

- National C minimum to referee at the tournament.
- \circ National certified Kata judge to judge at the Kata tournament
- Exception: we do welcome and encourage provincial level referees to attend and referee the U10 & U12 divisions.
- National B & C examination will occur during the tournament.

All entries including approval of an early bloomer's entry and second entries must be received by 2023 Friday October 7,

NOTE: To athletes intending to compete in more than one age division based on the "Early Bloomer Clause" – the regulations as published in the 2023-2024 edition of the "Tournament Standards and Sanctioning policy" will apply. <u>https://www.judocanada.org/tournament/</u>.

Entries received after the specified above deadline and changes are subject to an additional \$30/entry. Late entries, second entries and changes to the original registration will be accepted until the end of the accreditation period for the event – 18:00 on Friday October 13th 2023.

Eligibility

- Athletes must compete for the club of which they are a member in good standing and have a valid Judo Canada membership card.
- The registering entity (i.e. Country, Province, Territory, Club, Individual Coach) are/is responsible for ensuring that the athletes they register are eligible to compete. This includes the medical forms, waiver, and a confirmation of an early bloomer status where applicable.

U10 – Born in 2015 and 2016, yellow and up

U12 - Born in 2013 and 2014, yellow belt and above

Match Time: 2 minutes; No Golden score

No weight classes + separate Gender

Athletes are grouped with closest weight in round robin format of ideally 3-4 competitors

U14 – Born in 2011 and 2012 -Orange belt and above

KATA – Senior – Born in 2009 and earlier – brown belt and above

Nage-No-Kata; Katame-No-Kata; Ju-No-Kata; Kime-No-Kata; Kodokan Goshin-Jutsu

NE-WAZA** – Born 2009 and earlier – green belt and above

*Younger participants are allowed to compete as per the Early Bloomer clause:

** The organizers reserve the right to modify or combine weight divisions in case of an inadequate number of participants.

NOTE: No athlete is allowed to compete in three different age divisions in this tournament unless otherwise approved on a case-by-case basis by the High-Performance Committee. However, the Ne-waza and the kata events are not included in this restriction.

Competition Format

- <u>U10, U12</u>
 - Round Robin format will be used.
 - Categories will be 5 or less and will be drawn based on entries and weights.
 - Tournament regulations as per Judo Canada's Sanction Policy and Tournament Standards – 2023-2024.

- <u>U14, U16, U18, U21, Senior, Veterans, ne-waza</u>

- The modified double elimination format will be used.
- In weight categories with six (6) or seven (7) competitors, the double pool format will be used
- In weight categories with five (5) or fewer competitors, the round-robin format will be used.
- Tournament regulations as per Judo Canada's Sanction Policy and Tournament Standards – 2023-2024.

All issues/cases(s) that are unexpected or deemed exceptional circumstances will be solved by decisions taken by The Tournament Director.

Medal Ceremony

Medal winners must attend the medal ceremony in their WHITE judogi. Medal winners who refuse to participate in the ceremony will be removed from the result list and will not place (carding points may be removed).

No promotion articles are authorized to be used/displayed on the podium (flags, T-shirt, socks or similar items).

Insurance

Judo Canada and Judo Manitoba (or any of its officials or members) will not be liable or responsible for any personal injury nor for any loss or damage to any property resulting from participation and travelling in connection with these championships.

NOTE: The Tournament Director reserves the right to revoke the accreditation of anyone showing blatant disrespect for the rules and procedures of the competition or unethical behavior

Technical package – 2023 Manitoba Open

The modified double elimination system will be used during this event.

- Tournament Regulations as per Judo Canada's Tournament Standards and Sanctions policy unless specified otherwise in this document.
- A minimum of 2 competitors must be registered in a weight category for the competition to take place. A minimum of 2 pairs ore required for a kata division to be presented. A single pair can present as a demonstration only.
- Medals are only awarded if an athlete has won a match.
- This tournament will hold Kata competitions for KATAME-NO-KATA, JU-NO-KATA, KIME-NO-KATA NAGE-NO-KATA and KODOKAN GOSHIN JUTSU. There are no gender specific divisions, so all pairs are welcome (mixed or not). Multiple entries are accepted. The same competitor can enter only once in the same kata. Judging will follow the IJF 2022 kata competition criteria for the evaluation.
- FOR SHIAI: Both the blue and white judogis are mandatory.
- FOR KATA: White judogis only. No red & white belts.
- Each team (including officials) is responsible for reserving its own accommodation according to format specified in this package.
- Accreditation will be done at time of weigh-ins.
- No use of bleeding dyes on the body or hair of competitors is allowed. In cases such use is
 undetected and results in damage to the equipment of the opponent or the tatami, the
 competitor will be disqualified and the Provincial Association of which that individual is a
 member will be charged for the damage.
